# NAMI South Central Iowa Presents Appanoose Co. Sheriff Gary Anderson “Compassion in Crisis Intervention Award”

Dec. 22, 2020. The National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) South Central Iowa chapter presented their 2020 “Compassion in Crisis Intervention Award” to Appanoose County Sheriff Gary Anderson.

NAMI affiliates around the country host annual events to honor the work of law enforcement officers and emergency personnel who demonstrate compassion and understanding when dealing with individuals in mental health crisis.

This Award to Sheriff Anderson is believed to be the first one given in Iowa, according to NAMI South Central President-Dewey McConville.

“NAMI values the opportunity to say ‘thank you’ and raise the profile of successful crisis-intervention trained officers, like this law enforcement office in Appanoose County,” McConville said. “Sheriff Anderson was the overwhelming choice for the inaugural award, as he has for many years treated our citizens with dignity and respect, seeking treatment options first if pos-

sible, rather than incarceration for persons in mental health crisis. Due to the excellent example provided by Sheriff Anderson and his insistence that all deputies take the 40-hour crisis intervention training, Appanoose County citizens are very fortunate to

have a police force that shows our citizens respect and compassion at a time of crisis.”

The NAMI South Central Iowa regional chapter serves Appanoose, Wapello, Davis, and Mahaska Counties.

## Past Legis. Committee Lobbied for Our Present Age 55 Retirement; Keep Us Moving Forward By Being Active in this Association

ISSDA offers numerous benefits to all of our members. Members are eligible and are strongly encouraged to run for positions on the Board of Directors, as well as serve on the numerous committees (Schools, Legislative, Jail, Civil Book, Web Page, Community Relations, IPERS, Honor Guard and many others) that are a part of this great Association.

The ISSDA offers you the opportunity to join in the three different schools we conduct each year to provide training for our membership at a discounted registration fee for members. This past summer we had scheduled a regional one-day training in different locations throughout the state. Unfortunately, due to Covid-19 and proclamations from the Governor, this school event had to be postponed. The rescheduled date will be the summer of 2021 and is a free-training opportunity for ISSDA members.

Numerous years ago, the ISSDA Legislative Committee lobbied for the lowest retirement age among law enforcement groups in Iowa and this proposal was passed. Many members have taken advantage of this option to date. As our Financial Director, Retired Sheriff Bill Sage points out often and will attest to...this is a GREAT option! Qualified personnel are allowed to retire and start receiving their IPERS monthly benefits at age 55, after having served 22 or more years of service, and maxing out after 30 years of service. Another added feature not offered to other IPERS classifications is the income level

option (aka "bridge") that the ISSDA was able to get added to this piece of legislation. The Bridge is an opportunity offered to law enforcement where IPERS will supplement funding from the Social Security Administration (SSA) until which time you reach the age to receive that SSA funding from SSA.

The current priority items for the Legislative Committee are improving access to mental services, increasing the charge to Vehicular Homicide when the speed of the vehicle exceeds the speed limit by 25 mph resulting in a death, Hands-free communication while driving, the protection of Sheriffs' & Deputies pensions, clarifying civil judgments for Jail room & board fees, correcting the sex offender loophole, modernizing garnishment notifications, and social & criminal justice reform.

Membership in ISSDA also includes a death benefit, where there is different amount for a line-of-duty death versus a death from natural causes. The death benefit also covers retired/vested members that continue to pay their yearly dues or the retired/vested member could opt to pay a one-time fee of \$200 to become a lifetime member of the ISSDA.

Past ISSDA members have worked hard over the years to get us to the current position we are in, ensuring that we can offer quality training and benefits to our membership. The least we can do is continue to improve through the types of training that we can offer. To keep moving forward, this needs to be a group effort to encourage all eligible co-workers to become a member, and encourage retiring members to become lifetime members. Above all else, the most important thing is to become an active member of the Association and to run for the Board of Directors. Contact President Thompson about serving actively on a committee or in a Board of Director's position. At the very least, you will meet and get to know a lot of great people, devoting some worthwhile time to your chosen commitment. New and fresh ideas are welcomed and essential for improvements.

We all have a vested interest to insure ISSDA continues to improve by working together, increasing membership, serving on the ISSDA's committees, sharing different points of views, while honoring the hard work and dedication of those that served before us.

Rita Roberts, age 60, of Lime Springs, Iowa, passed away on January 17, 2021.

Roberts was born on Oct. 30, 1960, in Columbus, Wisconsin, to Jerome and Beatrice (Schmitt) Weisensel. She attended St. Jerome Catholic Grade School and Columbus High School, graduating in 1978.

She worked in banking before moving to Houston, Texas, where she fell in love with an Iowa boy after being set up on a date by her parents and soon-to-be mother-in-law. Rita moved to Lime Springs in the fall of 1986. After a motorcycle accident in 1987, she married the love of her life, Tony, at the Saint Mary's Hospital in Rochester, Minnesota on Aug. 29, 1987. The date was special to the couple, as it was her Mom's birthday and she wore her mother-in-laws gown. Rita always teased it was because of "the Moms" that she was this happy.

Roberts held many jobs from bartending, clerking and tutoring to becoming the first female hired in the Fareway Meat Department in Cresco. She loved her work at Notre Dame School as a secretary and food service director. In 1999, enroute to a family Christmas she applied for a dispatcher position with the Howard County Sheriff and was hired in January 2000 where she was



still working.

She was an active volunteer in the community with Junior Community Club, Firemen Auxiliary, Children's Theatre, Boy Scouts, Vacation Bible School and My Club Mentoring. A member of Notre Dame Parish landed her a position as a CCD teacher and lector. Rita enjoyed fishing, 4-wheeling, playing cards, but mostly spending time with family and friends.

Survivors include her husband, Tony of Lime Springs, a son, Thomas (Cami) of Clarksville, TN, siblings; Terry (Marcia) Weisensel of Sun Prairie, WI and Tim (Candy) Weisensel of Wautoma, WI. Rita is also survived by her in-laws; Tim Roberts of Lime Springs, Ann (Bruce) Saulnier of Ft Meyer, FL, Rena (Dean) Pecinovsky of Grand Meadow, MN, Ed (Jill) Roberts of Grand Meadow, MN and Ted (Amy) Roberts of Lime Springs, several nieces, nephews, aunts uncles and cousins.

## Noted central Iowa shooting instructor, transport driver passes

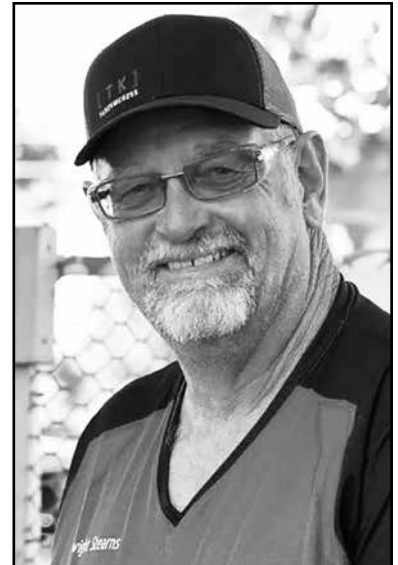

The Dallas County Sheriff's office is mourning the loss of a longtime team member, Transport Officer Dwight Stearns of Earlham, who died from complications of COVID-19.

"Dwight was a great husband, father, grandfather, employee and friend to many," the Sheriff's Office said on its Facebook page. "He always had an inviting smile and a warm heart that he shared with everyone he met."

Stearns was the Dallas County Sheriff's first full-time transport officer, and he built the transport division into what it is today, personally training every person in the transport division. He was also responsible for countless firearms certifications for peace officers all over Iowa and the Midwest.

"Dwight was an avid firearms competitor and well known throughout the state of Iowa as a world-class shoot-



er," the Sheriff's Office said. "He loved to share stories and videos of others that he had coached or mentored."

Stearns began his public service in 1975 by joining the U.S. Army, where he rose to the rank of sergeant. He started working for the Earlham P.D. in 1980 and retired after 31 years as their chief of police. He led the Dallas County Sheriff's transport division for nearly 10 years. "There isn't a county jail or state prison that Dwight hasn't been to," the Sheriff's Office said. "He had friends in every single part of the state of Iowa. R.I.P. Dwight, and thank you for your lifetime of service."

Retired Ringgold County Sheriff, U.S. Navy Veteran, Farmer and Truck Driver

Retired Ringgold County Sheriff Lyle Minnick passed away on November 24th 2020 due to Covid 19 complications. Lyle was a deputy for Ringgold County from 1976-1984 and was elected Sheriff in 1985 and retired in 1999.

Lyle Edward Minnick, age 86, of Kellerton, Iowa, the son of Loyd Cecil and Leona May (Davenport) Minnick, was born April 17, 1934, on a farm northeast of Mt. Ayr, Iowa. He grew up farming with his dad and brother, Richard, while attending school in Tingley, Iowa. There he played basketball and was on the baseball team which went to state. When Lyle was 16 years old he went to the Mt Ayr skating rink; when the whistle blew to switch partners he grabbed the hand of 14-year old Julia "Judy" Motsinger, they continued skating together for the rest of the evening. They dated for the next two years before they were married on January 23, 1953. They were blessed with four children, Norman, Tim, Todd, and Julie.

Lyle enlisted in the United States Navy in 1952 and was called to active duty in 1953. He served on the U.S.S. Randolph and the U.S.S. Coral Sea. 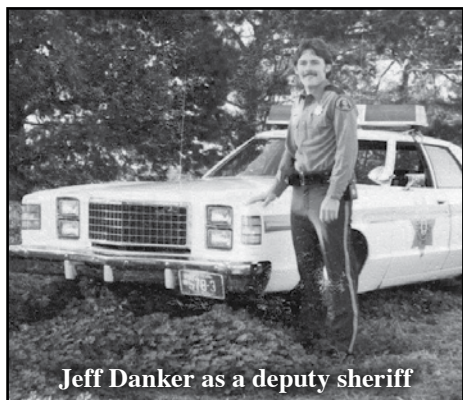

## Linn County Deputy William Halverson Presented with S.O. "Medal of Merit" for His Actions in Apartment Building Fire

On December 18 at 2208 hours, Deputy William Halverson was called to a structure fire at a multi-story apartment complex in Fairfax.

Deputy Halverson arrived within two minutes, observed smoke coming from the second floor roof line and tried to enter the apartment building's front door, which was locked. A tenant opened the door for him and a Fairfax firefighter.

Deputy Halverson went to the 2nd floor to contact a tenant believed to be in the burning apartment and pounded on the door with his flashlight. He observed soot seeping from around the door frame and smoke starting building in the hallway. Deputy Halverson directed the firefighter to alert other building occupants as he continued pounding loudly on the apartment door – with no response. He alerted an adjacent apartment tenant to evacuate, and still not getting a response from the apartment on fire went to the 3rd floor apartment to alert a man and his two children to evacuate the building.

Deputy Halverson again banged on the 2nd floor resident's door with no response, and went to the 1st floor to make certain all occupants were aware of the fire and evacuated the building. Deputy Halverson propped open the front security entrance door to ensure that other first responders could gain access to the



building. He told the Fairfax firefighter he believed the fire was in the second floor apartment and returned to that apartment and again banged on the door.

A second occupant of the burning apartment arrived with a key to the apartment. Deputy Halverson checked the apartment door for heat, they opened the and were met with a wall of heavy black smoke. The person who unlocked the door was immediately overcome by smoke and collapsed just inside the doorway, with both Deputy Halverson and the man coughing forcefully. The resident and Deputy Halverson left the smoke-filled apartment and the resident outside began yelling to the resident inside. Deputy Halverson pulled the

door shut, leaving it only slightly ajar. Deputy Halverson advised everyone to get out of the building and once again checked the 1st floor to make sure everyone was out of the building.

Deputy Halverson exited the building and checked with all of the tenants standing outside to ensure everyone was out of the building, and then completed another perimeter check looking in windows with his flashlight. Deputy Halverson updated the arriving Fairfax Fire Department personnel that the fire appeared to be in the second-floor apartment and that someone was believed to be in the apartment who could not be reached. Fairfax Fire Department personnel, assisted by the Cedar Rapids Fire Department, recovered the body of the deceased victim trapped inside.

Although a person tragically died in the fire, if it was not for the actions of Deputy Halverson and the initial arriving Fairfax firefighter, this most likely would have resulted in additional serious, if not fatal, injuries to other apartment occupants. Even though smoke detectors were reportedly installed in the building, none could be heard on Deputy Halverson's body camera and it is uncertain if they were all working properly.

Because of the actions of Deputy William Halverson in this incident, Sheriff Brian Gardner presented him with a Medal of Merit commendation award.

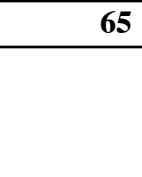

## Served as Jefferson County Sheriff from 1992-2000, Iowa State Patrol
